

FRESNO

This stemless, triangular point has straight to slightly convex or concave lateral edges, and a convex or slightly concave base. It is similar to *Cameron* but over 20 mm in length. Some of these specimens may be preforms and not a distinct type. However, on the Texas coast, carefully chipped specimens appear to represent a typological group.



Distribution: Widely reported throughout Texas, though most frequently in central, eastern and southern parts. **Period:** Late Prehistoric. **Sites:** Kenedy and Kleberg counties (41KL13); Hidalgo and Willacy counties (41HG4, 41HG5, 41HG9); Unland; Landslide; Lubbock Lake
